This seminar focuses on transitional innovations in water governance, public administration, corporate governance arrangements, and multi-stakeholder and multi-level decision-making processes.

The seminar examines how regulatory mechanisms and institutional arrangements can be combined in novel policy instrument mixes. It will showcase how 'blue sky thinking' and policy labs can lead to development and scaling of effective innovations on the ground and discuss elements for the creation of an enabling environment.
